NOTE . . . Shelling is best around low tides, especially after a storm. Law prohibits taking live shells, but there are plenty of empty shells on the beaches for everyone. Hunting them is great exercise and fun too!

#5 J. N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge:

The main entrance of the Refuge is located on Sanibel-Captiva Road near mile marker 2. The Visitor Center (472-1100) is open from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm seven days a week and offers free talks, tours, and eco-activities. The famed WILDLIFE DRIVE is open for bikers, hikers, and cars during daytime hours 7:00 am to dusk Saturday through Thursday. Take the Tram Tour (472-1351) for an environmentally friendly and educational way to see the refuge with a naturalist! Visitors can walk the Indigo Trail on Fridays. Two miles east of the main entrance at the north end of Tarpon Bay Road you will find the official Refuge concessionaire, TARPON BAY EXPLORERS, offering rentals of kayaks, bikes, and boats as well as guided tours designed to be both educational and fun. A Guided Kayak Tour or Nature and Sea Life Cruise offers an opportunity to see wildlife and discover the refuge with a naturalist by your side! You can paddle a kayak through mangrove tunnels, ride a bike through the refuge, or look for dolphins and manatees and go fishing in the back-bay waters of Tarpon Bay 7 days a week, 364 days a year between 8:00 am and 6:00 pm! Call the Explorers at 472-8900 for information and reservations.

"Ding" Darling's Bailey Tract (Self-Guided Tours) The tract is located on Tarpon Bay Road between Periwinkle Way and West Gulf Drive. Boardwalks and trails are open from dawn to dusk. Parking available. No motor vehicles allowed on hiking trails to preserve the natural beauty and serenity for visitors and wildlife.

#7 (SCCF) Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation: Near mile marker 1 on Sanibel-Captiva Road. The Nature Center which offers a butterfly house, touch tank, Nature Center exhibits, ethnobotany garden & 4 miles of trails with an observation tower is open 8:30 – 4 pm Mon. through Fri. "Turtle Tracks" is offered Thurs. 9:00 am (\$5 for non-members plus beach parking fee). "Otters & Others: Life Along Our Trails" offered Tues., Wed. & Fri. 9:00 am; \$3 for non-members. "First Mondays: Policy at SCCF" is offered the 1st Monday of the month at 10 am; free. "Dolphin & Wildlife Cruise" is daily at 4 pm (call 472-5300 for reservations for cruise). The Native Plant Nursery is open 8:30am – 5pm Mon-Fri (closed for the noon hour) 472-1932. The nursery provides native vegetation for local gardens. Boaters & fishermen check out www.recon.sccf.org. #1 Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum: On Sanibel-Captiva Road near mile marker 1. Open 10 am to 5 pm 7 days a week! Continuous exhibits in The Great Hall of Shells, which include the new exhibit, "Calusa: The Original Shell People." Children's video and hourly slide shows are also presented. Admission is \$7 for adults, \$4 for ages 5 to 16, 4 and under, free. For additional information, call 395-2233.
